## THANK YOU, CHURCH FAMILY!!!

In March, there was an offering for Ralph, Vicki and Austin Hale, our missionary church-planters who have sown generously in Perm, Russia, for the past 7 years. They are home on furlough for the next few months, traveling and reconnecting with friends and family around the US. They have seen many changes in the lives of the Russians over the past few years.

One big change recently is that the value of the dollar has dropped. The dollar doesn’t buy as much in Perm as it used to, even 2 years ago. The Hales have been serving for 7 years in Perm and have a need to be “reoutfitted.” They are not the Israelites wandering in the desert, and so clothes and furniture wear out over time. We as a church family wanted to bless them by taking an offering to help with these expenses. We gathered almost \$10,000!!!! (No, that is not a misprint. . .there are four zeroes!) Thank you, church family, for being a part of blessing this family’s life and for helping them to be a blessing to the people of Russia.

We praise God that He is “able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work.” (2 Corinthians 9:8)

## Tsunami Offering Update

We also want to thank the church for its generous offering in the wake of the recent disaster in Southeast Asia. Here is a story of encouragement from some of our missionaries who are in one of the regions hit by the tsunami:

“A young man out of his mind with disappointment got prayed for twice. Several evil spirits left him. Many heart wounds were healed by the Lord. For two years of his life, his parents threw him out of the house because they couldn’t afford to raise him. He went to the house of a wealthy family in the village. They made him into a slave and didn’t pay him anything. They beat him. O, the sadness doesn’t have words. After several wounds were healed and spirits left, the Lord touched him in a strong way with the Holy Spirit. He cried out tears, but not in drops. He was leaning over a waste basket crying in streams. For 5 minutes his eyes were like faucets turned on. I didn’t know it was physically possible for tear ducts to produce that much liquid in such a short time. It was like God was washing years of sadness from him. Then we prayed for him to be filled with the Holy Spirit. He looked up from the waste basket with shining joy!!”

## Give Him Praise!

Clarence Moore (Extended Stay Ministry, “Hidden Homeless”): All-Round Suites has given us a room to use for ministry.

Foxfire: A party commissioning the new playground was an “unqualified success.” 3 adults and 4 kids volunteered, 20-25 residents and kids attended. Relationships continue to be established with residents.

D Church Plant: We’ve been in Tstan for nearly 8 weeks now and are settling in well. It took a while to get online, but now we have DSL!! All of our church planters are on the ground now and doing well.

Brooke Redwine: I am currently a student delegate at a leadership training course. Although this course is quite difficult in that it requires much of my time and energy, it has been so helpful. I have learned a great deal about myself as a person, but also as a leader.

Coyles: We are doing well over here. We are actually expecting our first baby in June. Pregnancy is going alright, except I am having some pretty bad back trouble and am having to lie down a lot. The Youth Ministry is growing and expanding over here. We are starting small groups this month. We are very excited that we’ll be able to connect more with teens on a deeper level.

Hallers: Kids are being adopted out just about every month. We are starting a wok out in another province where we are helping a few local people as they take in unwanted babies.

Asckar: We are doing well and off to another adventure. We were invited to do an intensive course in a town 3 hours away from where we live now. It’s a four month course, with a very busy schedule. We believe God is taking us for these four months to have a time of being refreshed and getting nourishment to continue to nourish others.

M Family: On Good Friday evening, the Passion of Christ was shown on national TV! It was not announced in the papers in order to avoid it being shut down ahead of time, and to minimize possible violence from radical groups. Lord, cause many to ask further about Jesus!

## Please pray for our missionaries

Hidden Homeless: Keturah would like to start post-abortion counseling and a women’s Bible study and is praying for someone to come to lead a children’s program there. We are also praying for committed, long-term volunteers for this ministry

Foxfire: Planning for a youth event is in the works. Please pray that details will get worked out.

Coffin Family: These pastors of the Marietta Vineyard are in the stages of planning to go to Delhi to plant a Vineyard there. Please be praying for them as they continue to raise support and make final plans to go.

Brooke Redwine: I’ve been praying quite intentionally for the past six months about my role on the base here, and God has revealed to me that His plan is much bigger than I could imagine. I have begun to look at “outside YWAM” options and the possibility of returning to Atlanta before the end of the year. My leadership here on the base are actively praying with me through this decision, and I appreciate your prayers as well.

Coyle Family: Please continue to lift up having some close people to meet with, be friends with, be accountable to, etc. Every time we get slightly close to someone, they leave. This is a transient city and we feel rather lost and alone, even after 4 years of living here. Please also lift up our future. We are considering taking a sabbatical sometime at the end of this year, but there are a lot of questions with that.

Drushinin Family: We will be living with a family for the next month in order to learn the language and culture. Please pray that the Kingdom would flow through us and touch this family during our time there. Pray for us during this intensive time of culture acquisition, that the language will come quickly and easily and that culture shock will be minimal.

Dilovar: I am meeting mainly students and old people. There are 3 universities near where I live and a market as well. Please pray for God’s guidance, a sober mind in work, opportunities and open doors, and a godly wife.

Hale Family: Pray for traveling mercies as we travel around the US reconnecting with friends and family.

M Family: The Day-after-Easter earthquake has not effected our teams. They felt the shaking, but are safe and sound. Neighboring Christian islands are devastated—we hear 95% of capital city buildings are destroyed, thousands trapped under rubble.
